The dedication to detail and the inability to settle for anything less than perfection were both wonderful life lessons that carried over into my personal and professional life.

Share something you remember from your time in BPS.

My memories of musicals with Mr. Hanon stick out as some of the most fun moments of high school. I remember going to the old market with the entire cast, standing outside a radio station, and singing some of the songs live on the radio (I think it was music from "George M" with now-famous Billy McGuigan in the lead). Really fun times with great people.

Oh, the Taco Bell on Galvin was our hang-out. Why? I have no idea! But if we weren't there, we were at friends' houses. Village Inn was another popular spot.

It was a wonderful opportunity to move my young family closer to relatives too (my parents). Fortunately, my wife found a great job that she loves as well. I was very lucky the stars aligned, and I opened the first Dunkin' in Nebraska back in 2013.

What is your favorite donut?

We don't even make it anymore unfortunately, but it was the "marble frosted" which is a chocolate frosted donut with some vanilla frosting swirled on top.


Which of your accomplishments in life are you most proud of?
